INFORMATION REGARDING THE REAL ESTATE SELLER DISCLOSURE LAW

 - c. A certificate of occupancy or a certificate of code compliance has been issued for the dwelling.

In addition to these exceptions, disclosures for condominiums and cooperatives are limited to the seller's particular unit(s). 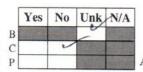
